(1., by requiring the payment of a License Tax for the year 1906 by persons or corporations engaged or intending to engage in any calling, business. occupation or profession in whole or in part in early lession, in whole or in part, in said Town as may herein be specified, and to provide a penalty for neglect or refusal to pay such License Tax:
