Notice is hereby given that this office will be open from Jan. 1, to Feb. 20, inclusive, 1908, for the purpose of receiving the returns of the tax payers of Marlboro county.

All persons having property in their possession as owner or holder, or husband, parent, guardian, trustee, administrator, accounting officer, agent, attorney or factor on the first day of January, 1908, are required to list the same for taxation within the time required by law, or receive the penalty of fifty per cent which attaches in case of failure to do so.

There is a poll tax of one dollar on all males between the ages of 21 and 60 years, except Confederate soldiers, and those otherwise exempt by law.
