CAN STOP SHIPMENTS

An Alabama Judge's Decision as to Prohibition.

Montgomery, Ala. - Railroad officers are worked up over the charge of Judge J. C. Richardson of a neighboring circuit, that any shipment of liquors from outside as well as in the State, are violations of the anti-shipping act, which provides against takeing intoxicants from a selling territory into dry sections.

It had been thought that it could not be made to apply to interstate shipments, but this judge says it can, on the ground that every state may provide its own police protection.
