

LUTHERAN BREVITIES.

Rev. H. Merz has gone to Chicago to establish a Samaritan Home in that city, after the pattern of the one in Philadelphia.

There are said to be 65 German Lutheran congregations in Greater New York, with a membership of 32,072.

The late Mrs. Martha McKnabb bequeathed \$9,000 to the German-town Orphan Asylum. Mr. Wm. Brann has been appointed treasurer of the Home.

A new congregation was organized in Tigerton, Wis., and an old Roman Catholic church building was bought and reconstructed for Lutheran services. New churches were also consecrated in Taunton, Minn., and in Cloyd Valley, S. Dak.

The first anniversary of the death of Oswald Ottendorfer, former editor of the "New York Staatszeitung," and founder of the "Isabella Home" for aged persons, was observed with religious services, addresses being delivered by Revs. Young and Hebler.

Emperor William has furnished a memorial window to the German church in Shanghai, China, of Baron Von Ketteler, murdered by the Boxers.

The Jerusalem Society in Germany, which supports the benevolent institutions in Palestine, numbers 80,000 members. Its receipts, last year, amounted to about \$22 500.

The new Melarction Memorial Museum, erected in Bretten, Baden, on the spot on which the house stood in which he was born, is under roof. But the interior is not yet finished, and additional contributions for that purpose are solicited. The dedication is to take place June 25th, 1902.
