Homer Axford that new eases, and are caused by congestion treatment for inoperable cancer has been tested, apparently with success, in the Polyclinic hospital in New York with which he is connected.

The treatment was discovered two years ago by Dr. Alexander Horovitz, of Cornell university.

Dr. Axford asserted in an address yesterday that experiments indicated # that a curative agent had been found for cancerous growths and all abnormal cell developments. He said the treatment had been applied in the Polyclinic hospital only in so-called incurable cases an dthat of 200 patients treated only one died. Experiments first were made in cases of chest cancer, but abdominal cancer

cases have shown improvement. The treatment was described as the injection of an extract of vegetable origin. Dr. Axford said many months would be required to complete the investigation of the new treatment.
