



WHEREAS, Charles Malcolm Reaves was on the 17th day of December, 1915, duly adjudged Bankrupt under the Acts of Congress relating to Bankruptcy; and on the 15th ay of June, 1916, filed his petition the District Court of the United States for the Eastern District of South Carolina, alleging that he has fully complied with all the requirements of the said Acts and the orders of the Court touching his bankruptcy, and asking for a full discharge under the provisions of the aforesaid Act:
