EXCEPTION IS MADE FOR CAMP JACKSON

Washington.—Complying with the terms of the army bill awaiting the president's signature, Secretary Baker issued instructions for the discontinuation of all construction work and the purchase of real estate for aviation fields, balloon fields and air service schools. Where condemnation proceedings have been instituted to acquire real estate they will be countinued until specific authority has been obtained in each case to drop the proceedings. The only exceptions under the bill are in the cases of Camps Jackson, Gordon, Tay lor, Lee, Custer, Devens, Dix, Dodge, Grant, Meade, Pike, Sherman, Travis, and Upton.
