### MARKETS

**Live Stock and Meats.** Hog prices at Chicago declined 65c to 75c per 100 pounds during the week. Beef and butcher cattle were all the way from 25c to 75c lower, with feeding steers 35c to 50c lower. Veal calves declined \$1 to \$2.25 per 100 pounds. Choice handyweight fat lambs practically unchanged; lower grades of killing lambs are up 50c.

**Cotton.** Spot cotton prices declined 1883 points during the week, closing at 16.48c per pound. New York December futures are down 190 points at 16.55c.
