



CONTRACT LET FOR IMPROVING BASIN

W. W. JOHNSON WILL PUT CEMENT LINING IN BIG RESERVOIR

WORK STARTS SOON

Approximately 325 Cubic Yards of Concrete Will be Put Down-Cost \$2,500

The contract for cementing the basin of the reservoir northwest of the city has been let by the Southern Public Utilities company to W. W.

Preliminaries for carrying out the contract are under way already, and the actual work of pouring the concrete will begin about March 15. Approximately 325 cubic yards of concrete work will be necessary to line the bottom and sides of the reservoir. volr. The improvements will cost approximately \$2,500.

Some time ago, it will be recalled, the Southern Public Utilities company's resident manager, Mr. H. A. Orr, announced that the company would build a new filter plant on Cox Creek and cement the bottom and sides of the reservoir northwest of the city. The new filter will be ready for use in a few days, and will double the supply of pure drinking water for the city.
