

They Seize Dismantled Russian Vessel in Neutral P. rt.

Heavy Bombarement of Port Arthur Forces Russian Warships to Seek Safer Quarters.

▲ special from Che · Foo says: A boarding party from a Japanese torpedo destroyer boarded the dismantled Russian torpedo boat destroyer Reis hitelni Thursday morning at 3:30 o'clock. The Japanese discharged their small arms and during the firing a Russian was wounded. Daybreak showed a third Japanese destroyer towing the Reishitelni out of the harbor and all disappeared. The Japanese consul claims that the Japanese ships were ignorant of the dismantling of the Rieshitelni.
