

THE STATE UNIVERSITY.

Free Tuition in the South Carolina College—II. The Statutory Argument.

The only answer to this is, that the instructions of the Legislature to the trustees, as to charging tuition fees, are not clear, and hence they must resort to the Constitution for elucidation.
