Method of Taxation to Relieve Small Owners of

Method of Taxation to Relieve Small Owners of

On March 7, W. W. Hall, managing editor of the Columbia State, read a very interesting paper before the Association in which he took the position that it would be right for the state to exempt all persons from taxation on so much as \$2,500 worth of property. There are some of the ideas Mr. Hall advanced.

The average size of the South Carolina farms is 76.4 acres. Since 1890 the size of the farm has been decreasing steadily and it average value has been increasing. In 1905 the average farm was 54.3 acres. Between 1900 and 1910 the total farming acreage of the state decreased 3.4, but the improvement that increased 10 per cent. The number of South Carolina farms has increased 10 per cent during the last 10 years, while the value has been only 15 per cent. In other words, the tendency has been and is to have more acres cultivated and developed of the land and the concentration of the tendency for small farms to the tax on the land.

Three-fifths of the farms in South Carolina are from 10 to 25 acres, and a little more than one-fourth from 10 to 15 acres. Nearly one-half are under ten acres in size while 10 per cent of the total. There are, however, 111,000 tenant farmers and in many cases many of these tenants farms are the property of a single landlord.
