MINERS OPPOSED TO WAR

Convention From All Nations To Protest Against Struggle.

(By Associated Press)

Cardiff, Wales, August 1.—The executive council of the Bouth Wales Miners' Federation today refused to accede to the suggestion of the British admiralty that the miners in the collieries aupplying vessels of the navy should work on Tuesday and Wednesday next, which had been arranged as miners' holidays. The council took the ground that it was not necessary for defensive purposes for the miners to work, and they declined to encourage British intervention in a European conflict.

The members of the council suggested that this was an opportune mineral for the miners of Europe to force upon the government their views condemnatory of war and triged the calling of a convention of miners of all nations with this object in view.
