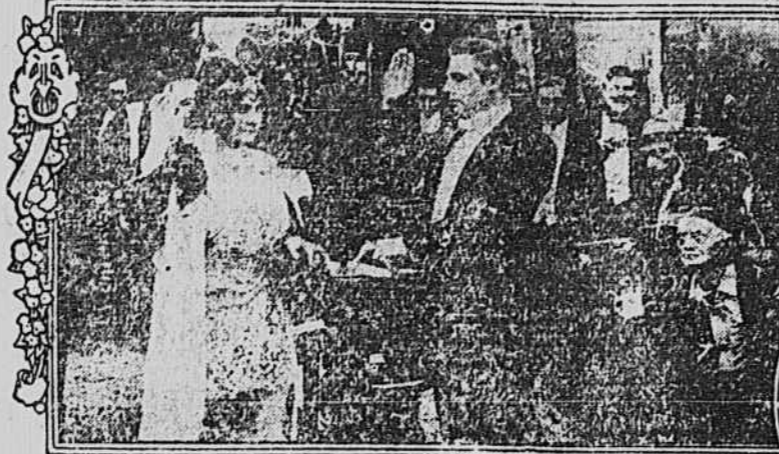

THE PROGRESS OF THE WAR

As Shown In the Associated Press Bulletins Received During Thursday

London, August 4.—A proclamation by the king, ordering the mobilization of the British army was read from the steps of the royal exchange. Immense crowds cheered and sang "Britannia."

Washington, August 4.—The German embassy severed notice today on the United States that a state of war exists between France and Germany. This is tantamount to a declaration of war, and differs only in technicality.

Brussels, Belgium, August 4.—A special train carrying all the securities of the Belgian capital left last night for Antwerp.

San Francisco, August 4.—North German Lloyd steamer Kronprinzessin Cecilie, carrying more than ten million dollars in gold, whose whereabouts have been a mystery since last Tuesday when she sailed

from New York for Germany, arrived here this morning. (This is the German trans-Atlantic steamer whose wireless messages were heard on the coast of Scotland Sunday night and she turned back to the United States.)

London, August 4.—The German cruiser Bremen bombarded the French naval station at Bizet, Algeria, at 6 o'clock Tuesday morning. Dispatches to French embassy here.

Tokyo, Japan, August 4.—Japan announced today that it has reached the Orient and may find it necessary to participate in fighting the Anglo-Japanese alliance if England is involved.

Paris, August 4.—Dispatch from N. H. Servis, says Austrians were defeated with heavy losses in battle with Servians Sunday near Semendria.

DEPARTING TOURISTS HELD UP BY GERMANS

Brussels, Belgium, August 4.—Hundreds of American tourists surprised by events in the European situation hurried from Switzerland and Germany to Luxembourg and Belgium. Railroad communication being interrupted at the German frontier many hired horses and carriages, piling their baggage on the vehicles. Others arrived exhausted on foot in Luxembourg whence a great party reached Ostend en route for London.

Several hundred tourists are said to have been held up between Basel, Switzerland and Luxembourg, the German authorities refusing to let them continue on their way.

The American minister to Belgium, Brand Whitlock, and the American consular officials are interesting actively in the situation.

MAKING PLANS FOR CONFERENCE

Senator E. D. Smith Will Go To Washington Some Time This Week

Columbia, Aug. 4.—Commissioner Watson, president of the Southern Cotton congress, after a conference today with members of leading business men of the state, summoned Senator E. D. Smith for a consultation on the impending cotton crisis, and Senator Smith announced that he will go to Washington next Saturday to confer with administration leaders as to the plan of procedure for the Southern Cotton Congress, to be held in Washington next week.

Senator Smith said tonight, "What is to be done, must be done at once before the cotton begins to move in any volume."

All Work Stopped.

Dunfermline, Scotland, August 4.—Work in the coal mines in the counties of Fife, Kinross and Clackmannan, the output of which is shipped to the continent, has virtually stopped. The supply of Max cotton and D in factories is about exhausted before the end of the week in and operatives will be out of work.

MRS. ROOSEVELT HAS FEVER

Mild Attack of Typhoid Contracted by Mrs. Kermit Roosevelt. (By Associated Press.)

New York, August 4.—Mrs. Kermit Roosevelt is ill in a New York hospital of typhoid fever. The attack is said to be a mild one. Mrs. Roosevelt is the daughter of Joseph P. Willard, American ambassador to Spain. Her condition today was improved, it was stated.

ENGLAND DECLARES WAR

London, Aug. 4.—Great Britain declared war on Germany at 7 o'clock tonight. The announcement that Germany had declared war on Great Britain was due to an error in the admiral's statement.
