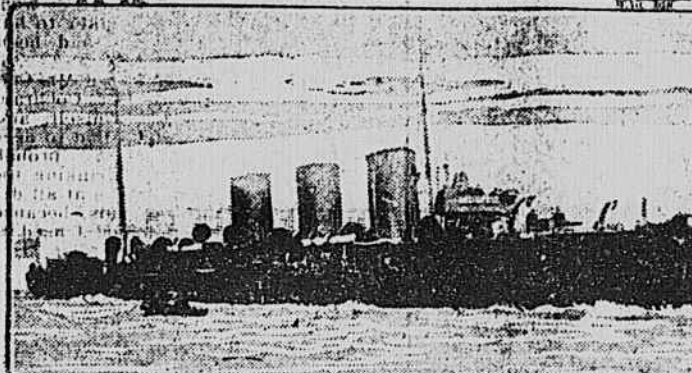
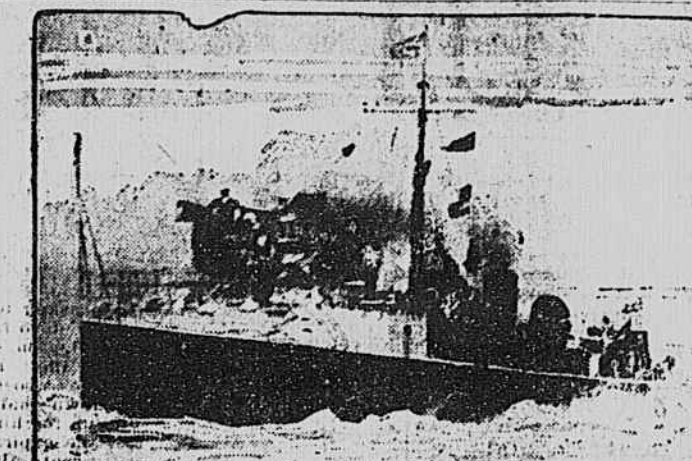

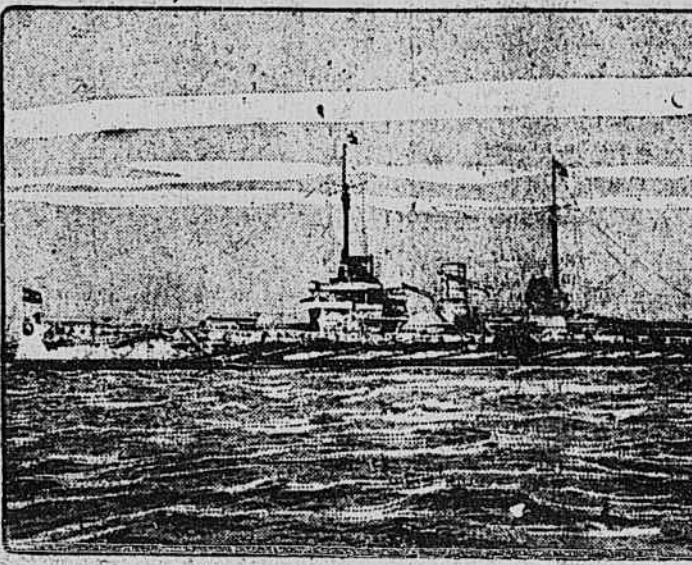

They were all built about six years ago and have a displacement of 18,602 tons each.

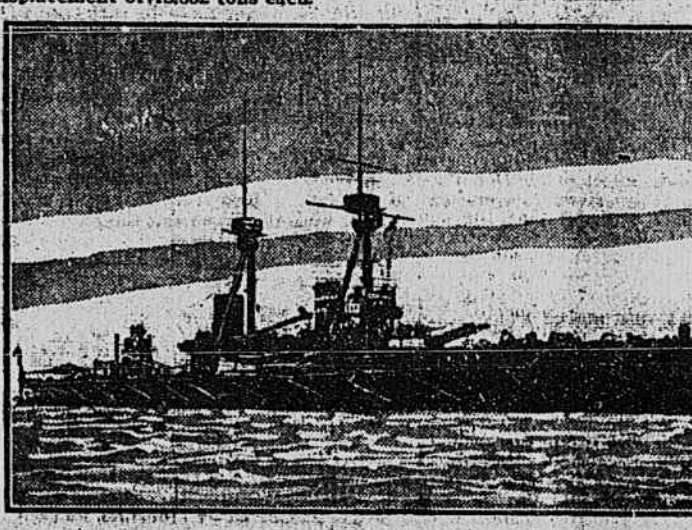
