Extreme Cold Weather Brings Big Crop Ice. Not in years has such quantities of ice and "jack" frost made its appearance so early in the season in this part of the country, say some of the oldest inhabitants. The ice and "jack" frost crop yesterday morning was especially heavy. It was reported that the mill ponds about the city, or rather those in which no warm water is turned, were coated over with ice. Along the country roads every mudhole that contained the least quantity of water the night before was frozen over, and in some instances the crust of ice had the appearance of being at least a quarter of an inch thick. Hoar frost, or "jack" frost, as it is better known, was three and four inches tall in places, and every spot where there was the least dampness supported a full crop of the formation.

Putting Finishing Touches on Building. The finishing touches are being put on the new building on North Main street of Ligon & Ledbetter. Yesterday the small wooden house which stood in the street in front of the building was torn away, and in the immediate future the plank fence will be torn from in front of the new structure. The small house referred to was used for the storing of materials, tools and the keeping of the blue prints, etc., of the engineers while the building was in process of erection. The work of setting the saah in the new structure is also going on, while the iron fence about the concrete balcony overhanging the railroad track has been placed. The finishing up of the interior and the front of the storerooms is under way, and in the course of a few days the building will be ready for occupancy.

Pelzer Fellows Are Bound Over. J. Frank and Gus Simmons, brothers, and Oscar Sergeant, all white and residents of Pelzer, have been given preliminary hearings before Magistrate John W. Danner at Pelzer on serious charges and bound over to the court of general sessions for trial. The Simmons brothers are charged with aiding and abetting in the burning of a building, which they owned at Pelzer, in order that they might collect the insurance. Sergeant is charged with arson, it being alleged that he fired the building. The Simmons brothers were released some time ago on bond of \$300 each, signed by Dr. W. R. Denny and a Mr. Taylor. Sergeant is out on bond in the sum of \$55, signed by his father and W. W. Griffin. The cases will be called for trial at the terms of general sessions court convening here the first Monday in February.

Governor Blease Seeking Information. Judging from inquiries which have come to the office of Clerk of Court James N. Pearman from the office of Governor Blease, negotiations for the procuring of evidence for four convicts from Anderson County are under way. Information from the records is desired in the cases of Charles and Rether Henderson, who were convicted of murder at a recent term of court and given terms of imprisonment for life; Jefferson Nix, the aged white man who is serving a sentence in the county jail for an offense committed here 23 years ago; and Julius Davis, serving a term of three years on the gang for manslaughter. The Henderson negroes, it will be recalled, became involved in a row with three negroes by the name of Ellington, with the result that two of the Ellington men were killed. The negroes were tried on but one case. The killing occurred on the plantation of W. John McClure, six miles west of the city. The Davis negro killed another negro by the name of Jim Emerace, in North Anderson, several months ago.

Theatre Scenery Now Being Made. The Chamber of Commerce yesterday received a letter from the firm which has the contract for the manufacturing of the scenery for the Anderson theatre, stating that work is under way on the scenery and that it will be completed by January 15.
