FINAL DECISION AS TO COMING OF CADETS DECIDED TODAY

ALL IS READY FOR THE EVENT

Corps Scheduled to Spend From Monday Until Friday in This City—Round of Interesting Features

Arrangements for the encampment here this week of cadets of Clemson College were practically complete last night. Details yet to be attended to will be looked after tomorrow forenoon, and when the corps arrives in Anderson shortly after midday and proceed to their camp ground, on the Roberts property, on North Main street, everything will be found in readiness for them.

Hinges on Weather.
The coming of the cadets tomorrow hinges, however, upon weather conditions. Col. J. M. Cummins, commandant, who was in the city yesterday looking after matters in connection with the encampment, stated the final decision as to whether the cadets would encamp this week would be made Sunday, when he would be able to tell with more certainty what weather conditions are likely to be during the proposed stay of the cadets in Anderson.

If it is found necessary to call off the encampment on account of unfavorable weather, the event will be postponed not longer than a week, Col. Cummins stated.

The commandant stated that it would not be wise to hold the encampment during a season of unfavorable weather, or, in other words, it would be dangerous to bring the cadets out of steam-heated barracks and quarter them in tents in such weather as Anderson experienced yesterday.

Schedule Planned.
If it is decided today that the encampment will be held beginning tomorrow, the cadet corps will leave Clemson College early Monday morning and march as far as Sandy Springs, where they will have dinner. At this station the cadets will entrain for Anderson. Special cars will be at Sandy Springs to bring them to the city.
