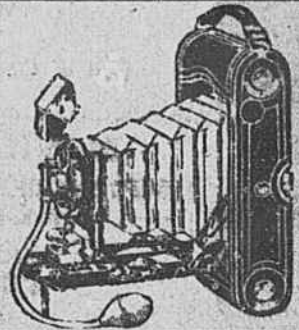

NEW BAKERY WILL BE IN OPERATION SOON

IMMENSE MODERN OVEN IS IN PLACE AND READY FOR FIRING UP

IS UP TO DATE

Anderson Pure Food Company Will Have One of the Most Modern Plants in the State

Indications are that the Anderson Pure Food Company, bakers, will move into their elegant new quarters in the Watson-Vandiver building, on North Main street, next week. The large modern oven has been set up as soon as certain equipment which was shipped to Anderson, Ind., instead of to this city arrives everything will be in readiness for the transferring of the business from its present stand on West Benson street to the new quarters.

The oven which the company has installed in its new quarters is probably the most modern in this section of the country. It is an immense affair, as is indicated by the fact that it can cook 400 full size loaves at one time. It is what is known as the "German-American Portable Brick Oven," and is manufactured by the Hubbard Oven Company, of Chicago and New York. Patents on the oven have been taken out in the United States of America, Canada and Europe.

There is a steamer in connection with the oven, and in this respect it is unlike any other oven in this portion of the country. This steamer generates steam and passes it into the oven while the bread is baking, thereby keeping the atmosphere moist and preventing a hard crust forming on the bread and the loaf coming out dry.

Other modern equipment to be installed in the bakery is an immense sieve machine, machines for mixing the bread and molding it. The big oven has two large doors where the bread is put in and taken out. These doors are so connected with the electrical apparatus that when the door is opened for the purpose of looking in at the bread an electric light is turned on, thereby lighting up the most remote corner of the big oven. The oven burns coke and bread is cooked at a temperature of something like 450 degrees.

When the plant has been completed and is ready for operation the management will probably have an "opening day," when the public will be invited to visit the place and inspect a modern bakery.

RUSSIANS CLAIM MADE PROGRESS

Germans Are Attempting to Prevent Advance at Osowetz. PETROGRAD, March 25.—The struggle in northern Poland is apparently drawing toward the decisive stage. The Germans are still attempting to pierce the Russian line at Osowetz, endeavoring to prevent the Russians from advancing to the north and south of the fortress by placing troops between it and the Prussian border.

The Russian reports assert that considerable progress has been made recently and that the Russian troops at places are within a few miles of the border. The Germans claim that the Russian attacks in this region were repulsed.

CATTLE INDUSTRY GOING TO DOGS SAYS SPEAKER

SAN FRANCISCO, March 25.—Alarming conditions in the cattle industry were described by H. A. Jastro, president of the American National Livestock association, in his annual address at the opening of the association's convention yesterday. Unremunerative prices, ruinous market fluctuations, fear of the effect of the removal of duties on cattle and meats and unsatisfactory range conditions were given as the unfavorable factors. He said, however, there was no shortage of cattle.
