A fully developed case of "black leg" disease, which attacks cows, has been d'scovered in Anderson, the victim of the dread malady being a cow belonging to Mr. E. H. Ballentine, on Powers street, Dr. J. C. Mitchell, veternarian, has diagnosed the case and yesterday when he talked with authorities at Clemson College about the matter they confirmed his diagnosis. Dr. Mitchell expects the cow to die in the next day or two, and after it has expired the premises where she is kept will be thoroughly disinfected. This disease is very fatal among cattle, something like 95 per cent of the cases resulting in death. the cases resulting in death.


