The car is splendidly equipped and will be accompanied by experts from Clemson College who will lecture and

give dairy demonstrations and answer questions pertaining to this subject. tions in dairy equipments, handling of milk and its products and butter-

making, as well as lectures by dairy experts.

The coming of this car is announced in large display posters which have been sent out by Prof. W. W. Long, State Agent and Director of Extension Work, with headquarters at Clemson College.

Ladies are specially invited to attend the lectures and view the demonstrations.
