THE HONOR SYSTEM.

Students of 123 universities and colleges in the United States are under the "honor system," according to a bulletin just issued by the United States Bureau of Education. Of these, 37 per cent are situated east of the Mississippi and South of Mason and Dixon's line; 4 per cent are in New England; only 6 1-2 per cent are for women, while 65 1-2 per cent are coeducational.

I.; Ohio University, Athens, Ohio; Vassar College, Poughkeepsie, N. Y.; Bowdoin College, Bowdoin, Me.; Clark College, Worcester, Mass.; Goucher College, Baltimore, Md.; and Trinity College, Durham, N. C. From President of Hammond School Improvement Association in Reference to Matter.

In a communication appearing below Mrs. Pat W. Major, president of the Hammond School Improvement Association, discusses in a very forceful and clear-cut manner the question of the value to the rural schools of a supervisor, and makes a plea for the continuation of this work.

Every rural community needs such a forum as the country school should provide, but it doesn't. The school improvement association is only beginning too, and we all know the most difficult thing is the beginning.

No one who studies the educational system of America and for one moment be content with the conditions of the rural schools of Anderson county today. New school buildings in the county are what they should be in comfort, in beauty, in refinement and in sanitation.

Is there such a atmosphere prevailing our rural schools? Here we need the work of a supervisor. We need her to direct the work of organized effort for the health of school children, and to help in giving them the education that will fit them for more efficient living.

Now should this work be separated? If the school improvement association will come forward and support this work by keeping the supervisors' office open, this problem will be partly solved.

Since we have reached the point of realizing the needs of a rural supervisor, our object is to keep the work going. In order to achieve results, we need something more than reaction and enthusiasm, we need system and directness of effort.
