DELEGATES NAMED FOR SANITARY CONVENTION

SOUTHEASTERN ASSOCIATION AT ASHEVILLE MAY 25-26

THIRD MEETING

Mayor Godfrey Names Large Delegation To Represent City of Anderson at Meeting.

Mayor Godfrey stated yesterday that he had appointed all members of the board of health, the members of the sanitary committee of city council, Dr. E. A. Hines, superintendent of the Anderson County Hospital; Dr. John P. Major, meat and milk inspector of the city, and Health Officer T. A. Campbell delegates from Anderson to the third annual meeting of the Southeastern Sanitary Association, which will be held in Asheville May 25-26.

Dr. W. Frank Ashmore, chairman of the board of health received from Dr. C. E. Smith of Greenville, meat and milk inspector of that city and secretary of the Southeastern Sanitary Association, the following letter with reference to the Asheville meeting:

The third annual meeting of the Southeastern Sanitary Association will be held in Asheville, N. C., May 25-26, 1915. We want your city represented. This is an association which admits to full membership all persons interested in sanitation and hygiene. We believe that this section needs an association which the health officer who is not an M. D. and others from small towns and cities can join and attend the meetings and feel at home. Our program will contain papers on every phase of practical sanitation.

An invitation has been sent your mayor to have your city represented at this meeting. If he has not made appointments, will you not take the matter up with him at once, and have him make them. We are very anxious to have your city represented.

We are anticipating a large meeting. A great many towns and cities have already signified their intention of sending delegates and we feel that no town in this section can afford to not be represented, as the towns will be benefited by what their representatives will learn by swapping experiences with other sanitarians.

During the entire week of May, the 24th, there will be a public health exhibition, showing the activities of State and municipal health departments. This will prove very interesting and instructive to public health workers as it will show in a graphic manner what is being done in this section.

I am inclosing you a little folder that I hope you will find time to read, after which you will decide to attend this meeting.

We were shown great hospitality by the good people of Belton. May they have the opportunity of entertaining the singers many times if they wish.

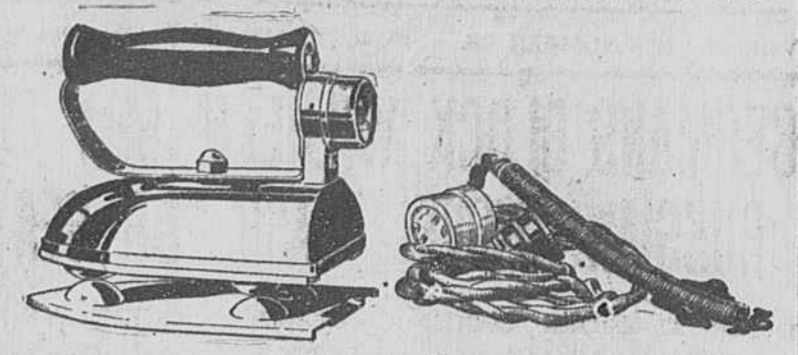
To everybody the Anderson County Singing Convention will meet at Belton on the fourth Saturday and Sabbath in ay.
