AFTER A SECOND SENATORIAL TERM

'The time to quit is when you are strong, and in my case, business has attained such proportions as to demand my undivided attention."



GARDEN FOR THE HOUSEWIFE

Quick Growing is Secret of Tender Crispness of Salad Plants—Keep the Soil Moist.

Among less common sorts asparagus-beets are very desirable, as the entire plant may be cooked for greens when young, or the large ribs and veins from the older leaves may be cooked and served as asparagus.
Brussels sprouts belong to the cabbage family and the tiny heads that form on the stalks are more delicate in flavor than most cabbage.
Kohlrabi seems like a cross between a cabbage and a turnip, but if cooked when young and tender has a flavor like cauliflower.
Petticoat (corn salad) may be sown and treated the same as spinach and furnishes one of the very early spring salads.
Lettuce are as easily grown as onions and being less in flavor are more desirable for some purposes.

FORTUNE IN GOLD AND FURS

Fall and Winter's Work Makes Spokane Prospector-Trapper \$27,000 Richer.
Spokane—More than \$27,000 as reward for a winter spent in hunting and prospecting is the record made by D. J. Matevich, who came to Spokane to sell furs caught in the Clearwater district in Idaho.
Matevich went into the district last September and spent the fall in prospecting. In October he came across a portion of creek bottom which had been swept clean by a cloudburst, leaving the crevices open. After a few pans he realized that he had made a big find, as every pan was showing strong color and running between ten and fifty cents in gold.
He located his claim November 19, and prospected as much as possible before snow fell. He says his washings averaged 25 cents a pan. Matevich has been offered \$25,000 for his mining claim.
After winter set in he hunted furs, and he brought to Spokane a pack worth \$2,000, one of the furs being a silver fox, valued at, approximately, seven hundred dollars.

CUREFOL LAW FOR YORK

Mayor John R. Lafean of York, Pa., Will Introduce Stringent Ordinance.
York, Pa.—Mayor John R. Lafean will introduce a "curfew ordinance." It will provide that children under sixteen years of age shall not be on the streets unattended or with improper company after nine o'clock between October 1 and April 1.
They must be attended by their parents or some reputable person. If they are employed at night or attend night school they will be provided with cards. A penalty of two dollars fine or 24 hours imprisonment of the parents or guardians in violation of the law has been fixed.
Warning bells and whistles will be given when it is time for the children to get off the streets.

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Don't Forget to Side Dress

After you have the plants well started, insure a crop by feeding it. For cotton, provide enough

POTASH

to make more bolls, good fibre, and to keep the bolls from falling and for corn, help the plant make the starch that fills the ears.
Try 200 lbs. each of mixture of equal parts of Kainit Acid Phosphate and Nitrate of Soda, or 5-5-5 goods.
Insure against cotton rust by side dressing of 200 lbs. Kainit per acre. Right side dressing prolongs the activity of the plants and produces a full crop of bolls that stay on the tree.
