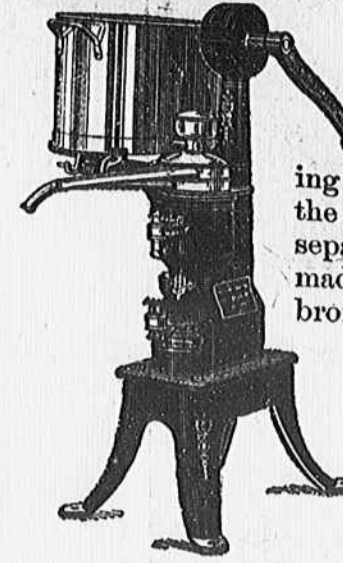

Notice of Election

Whereas, the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina passed an act at the last session authorizing the trustees of Reunion School District No. 12 to issue coupon bonds for the purpose of purchasing a lot or lots and erecting a school building and equipping same. The act furthermore authorizes an election to be held on March 20, 1915, to determine whether or not the trustees of the above-named district shall have power to issue and sell coupon bonds of said school district for an amount not exceeding \$2500.00 for the above-stated purpose.

Therefore, in accordance with the above-mentioned act authorizing the election, it is hereby ordered by the board of trustees that said election be, and the same is hereby ordered on March 20, 1915, to determine whether or not said bonds shall be issued or not, and that T. N. Smith, Carlis a Newton and Harmon Williams are hereby appointed managers of said election at Reunion school house. The said managers shall declare the result of said election and make returns thereof to the board.

It is further ordered that this notice be published in The Pickens Sentinel and the Easley Progress.
