A USEFUL INVENTION

Ridge Spring Man Secures Patent On New Device

Editor Saluda Standard:
 W. T. Durham of Ridge Spring, who formerly resided in Anderson county and who is yet a young married man, came to Ridge Spring about 10 or 12 years ago to enter school. After attending one session he liked the place so much that he became a citizen, entered the general mercantile and hardware business, has made a success and has proven himself a valuable asset to the town and community, and is considered one of the best and most worthy citizens. However, it is not of his business achievements that I wish to write, as I know his modesty would forbid, and I have mentioned the above only as a mere introduction of the man and his invention, which is a lap link of great use and durability, for which he has already been offered a right handsome sum.

It is a patented device that he has invented, applied for a patent, obtained it, has had it manufactured, placed on the market, tried out and found to be of genuine good use.

This invention is a new and useful improvement in coupling links, commonly called lap links or lap rings, all well known by farmers, mill men, teamsters and others handling or working with singletrees. Of the link the following is a description: It is designed in general for the various uses for which coupling lap links are employed, the primary object of the invention being to provide a coupling which, while simple of construction, is of maximum strength and durability and is adapted to be used without liability of the movable member casually opening and permitting separation of the coupled members.

A further object of this invention is to provide a coupling link in which the movable closure members present a maximum amount of surface of wear and is adapted to interlock with the body member in such a way as to effectively withstand the strains imposed thereon, while relieving the pivot from such strains, thus avoiding the well-known objections to coupling and lap links of types in general use.

Another favorable feature is the simple opening and closing of the link without the use of anything so hammer or prize with, which makes of it instantaneous application.
