A number of young people attended the singing held at Rice's Creek church Sunday.

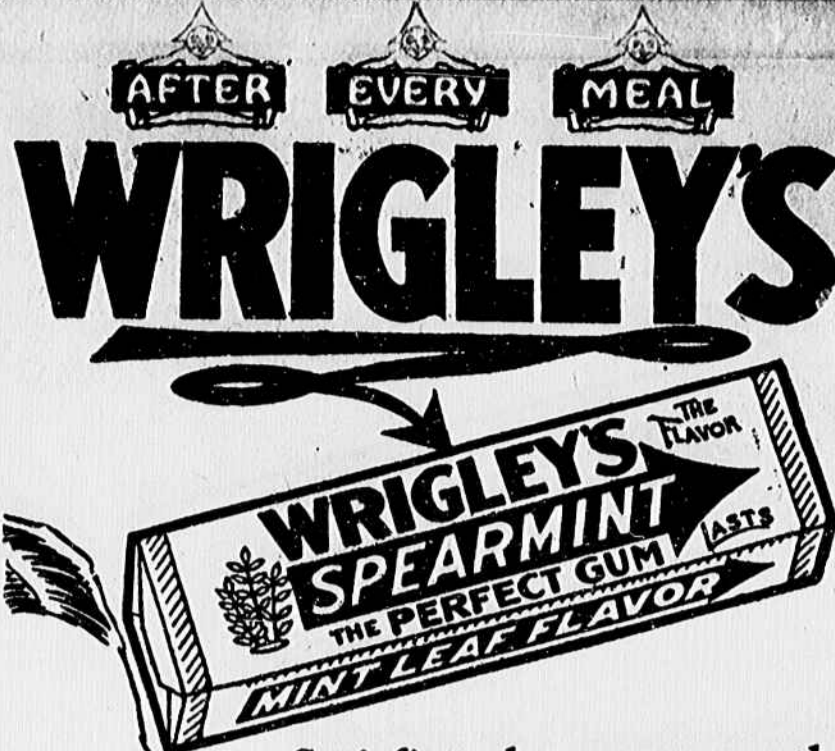
The Woman's missionary society met at the home of Mrs. Gilbert Fow- ler last Thursday afternoon. Those that were present report a good time.

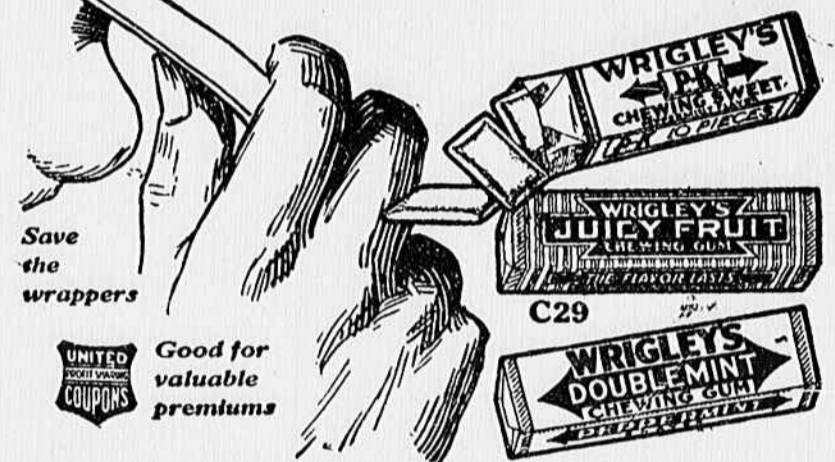

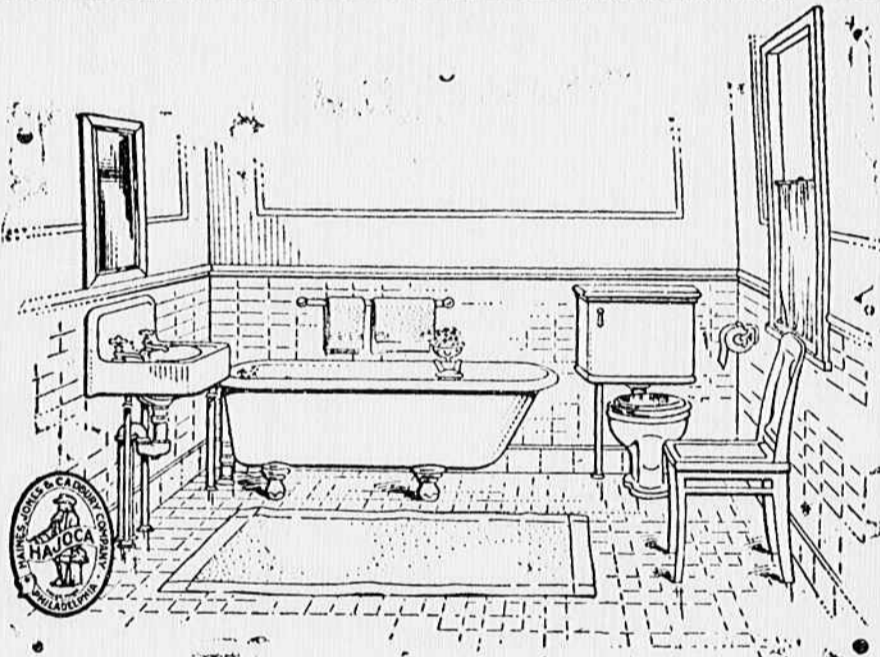
