## Bill Nay Before Senate Provides 1 Instalments.

Unpaid taxes, accumulated for two or three years, will be on the people this fall, especially large landowners n the lower part of the State.

The chief argument used against the extension of the time for the payment of taxes was that it failed to solve the problem and merely post-poned the sheriff's execution, and piled up a double burden for payday, fixed to fall before any financial relief can be hoped for.

Is it not the duty of the general assembly to provide a real solution? Are the farmers aware that this is contained in the Wells, McCravey Bill newly introduced in the Senate? I say "farmers," but I am told that many "bankers" say they cannot borrow the money to pay their back taxes.

This bill provides for the settlement

of past due taxes, to be hereafter due and payable in five annual installments, with seven per cent interest, along with the current taxes of 1922-3 1-5-6, and prevent the wholesale disfranchisement of our voters.

Taxes now in arrears amounting to 5500 on a plantation in the Boll-Wee. vil area could thus be paid through five years at the rate of \$100 a year, plus interest, instead of being all added to the taxes for the present

The people are undergoing an unprecedented strain. Their State should not press them to the wall, but should remit penalties and grant them. That is what banks and creditors generally have maganimously and wisely done since the "deflation" trap was sprung and universial bankuptcy has been pending.

This Bill furthur provides for the State to borrow at low interest in New York on the past due taxes as collateral and advance the cash to the counties, thus relieving schools and other public necessities from present suffering or stopping through the present impossibility to collect taxes. It meets the emergency.

The Bill is a solution-a relief to both tax-payers and counties, especially schools. It makes dead assets liquid and prevents general disaster. But time is short and quick action is necessary. Any one favoring the measure might telegraph his senator and write his representatives. Bernard P. Carey,


