#### AN ELEGANT PROGRAM FOR JULY 4.

A Great Day for All Cherokee County.

#### ALL KINDS OF RACES.

One Feature of the Day Will be a Bicycle Parade in Which the Riders Will Ride Decorated Wheels—Cash Prizes for the Contestants—Contests Open to All.

The Fourth of July celebration is assuming good shape, and the indications are that the approaching celebration will be one of the best ever held in Gaffney. It is true that there will be no speaker from abroad, but a local speaker of ability will deliver a short speech on that day. The program so far arranged is an elaborate one, and besides the advantage of being a program in which many of our home people can take part. The day is to be Cherokee's day, and with that end in view we expect a good deal of help from Blacksburg and Cherokee Falls.

Blacksburg is going to take a deeper interest in the celebration than ever before. An invitation has been extended to her to play ball with us on that day, and there is every reason to believe that her ball team will come over. A number of her society people will be present and attend the dance that night, and we hope several of her young men will take part in the tournament. It has been decided to make all the prizes cash prizes, except the lamb and the pig race. Every other prize will be a cash prize. The amount of these prizes has not been settled on, but the committee will make them just as large as the finances at their disposal will admit. The following program, subject to change, (but if any changes made it will be to add something to it) has been submitted by the committee:

Bicycle parade will form in front of the National Bank, with decorated wheels, at 8:30. Two prizes will be given—one for the best decorated wheel, and one for the most comic wheel.

The reel races will take place at 9 o'clock on Limestone street.

The tournament will take place at 10 o'clock on Rutledge avenue. Reading of the Declaration of Independence will take place at Limestone at 11 o'clock.

The boys' bicycle race, one-fourth mile, will take place at 11:30.

This will be followed in quick succession by the chasing of the lamb by the little girls, and the pig and boy race. The girl who catches the lamb retains it for the prize, and the boy who catches the pig will be entitled to it. These races will be confined to boys and girls under 14 years of age.

Next will be a wheelbarrow race, a potato race, three-legged race, etc.

At 12:30 dinner will be announced. There will be no free dinner. Spectators may secure dinner on the grounds, or bring it with them.

At 2:30 the program will be resumed, and will embrace sack racing, bicycle races of one-quarter mile, one-half mile, one mile, and three miles. A one-mile bicycle race for colored riders will be a feature.

This will be followed by a game of baseball.

There will be plenty of music, a brass band and a string band having been secured for the occasion.

The day's amusement will end with a dance in the evening. Every man, woman and child in this and adjoining counties is invited to be present and take part. It is desired to make this Cherokee's holiday, and we want all our friends to come and join us.

The barbecue privilege will be let to the highest bidder. Parties desiring privileges will do well to read advertisement in another column.

#### OFFICERS ELECTED.

Our Fire Department Reorganized—Officers Elected.  
At a meeting of the fire department held in the court house June 8, 1900, the following officers were elected:

Company No. 1. B. L. Hames, captain; A. W. Doggett, first assistant; J. L. Hopper, second assistant; J. F. Fincken, secretary.  
Company No. 2. E. L. Elson, captain; W. Baker, first assistant and secretary; W. F. Smith, second assistant.

Company No. 3. John Smith, captain; Sam Robertson and K. B. Laney, first and second assistants.  
W. S. Hall, Jr., was elected general secretary and treasurer.

It was agreed by the two white companies to have a contest on the fourth of July, the regulations to be determined by their respective captains. The following paper was read by former Chief Hall:

"I desire herewith to tender my resignation as chief of the fire department. This is not done to deliver myself of the duties and responsibilities, but with the desire to further the best interests of the department. Having never belonged to a fire company, and consequently having had but little experience in the work, it is not proper that I should attempt to hold a position, or desire reelection to a position where experience and knowledge are in such demand. I accepted the position I now hold only for the purpose of effecting an organization.

My relations with every member of the department have been pleasant, and I think every member deserves commendation for the interest he has shown in the face of so many difficulties.

It is my hope that the fire department may become a permanent and effective organization, and that they may receive encouragement and material aid from the citizens of Gaffney.

#### CHEROKEE'S FINANCES.

The Magnificent Management of the County Funds.

We have been permitted to get the following facts and figures from the records in the county treasurer's office, which show Cherokee's condition when she began business on her own hook. They show how much indebtedness she inherited from Spartanburg, Union and York counties; the amount from each county separately; how much has been paid in interest and how much of said debt has been retired, and the present financial status of each of the sections, including the amount on hand to the credit of each section with which to meet interest.

We think the showing made is evidence that strong, far seeing minds have been directing the finances of Cherokee county in a manner most beneficial to the county and creditable to themselves:
