"He made the best Home Mission secretary the church has ever had," said a Presbyterian minister this morning, when told of Dr. Craig's sudden death.

All the pastorates of the deceased were in Mississippi and and Virginia. He came to Atlanta fifteen years ago, and since that time has been the life of the mission work from this cen-

Dr. Craig's health through the summer was not good, but he was feeling excellently when he left here. Mrs. Craig said at the time that she would never see him again, though there was no reason for such a thought then.

He was 70 years of age. He leaves a wife and three children, Mrs. Bessie Brackett, of Virginia; Mrs. William Matthews, of this city, and John Newton

Craig, of this city.

At the time the sad news reached Atlanta there was no member of the family at home. Mr. Newton Craig was the first to learn it. One after another came home to hear the dreadful news. All are nearly prostrated by the shock.

Dr. Craig was one of the committee of three appointed by the Atlanta citizens' meeting to take charge of the fund for the Galveston sufferers, and it was largely due to his activity that so large an amount was promptly raised. His was a quiet, dignified life, full of good deeds.
