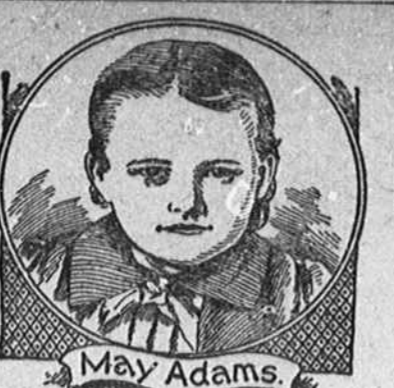

ELECTION MANAGERS.

Election, Aug. 20

WHEREAS, It was enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of South Carolina, at their last annual session, that an election be held on the THIRD Tuesday, 20th day of August, 1895, for the election of delegates to a convention of the people of South Carolina which is ordered to be assembled in the city of Columbia on the SECOND TUESDAY in September next, being the 10th day of the month, we the undersigned Commissioners of Election, have appointed the following Managers to conduct said election at the several precincts for delegates to said Convention. The Board of Managers for each precinct shall meet on or before the day of election and organize themselves into a Board of Managers by choosing one of their number Chairman, and some suitable person as clerk. The Chairman may then administer the oath prescribed in Article 11, Section 30, of (blanks for which will be furnished the managers) Constitution and the oath against dueling to each member of the Board and the clerk, and the clerk may in turn administer the same oaths to the Chairman:

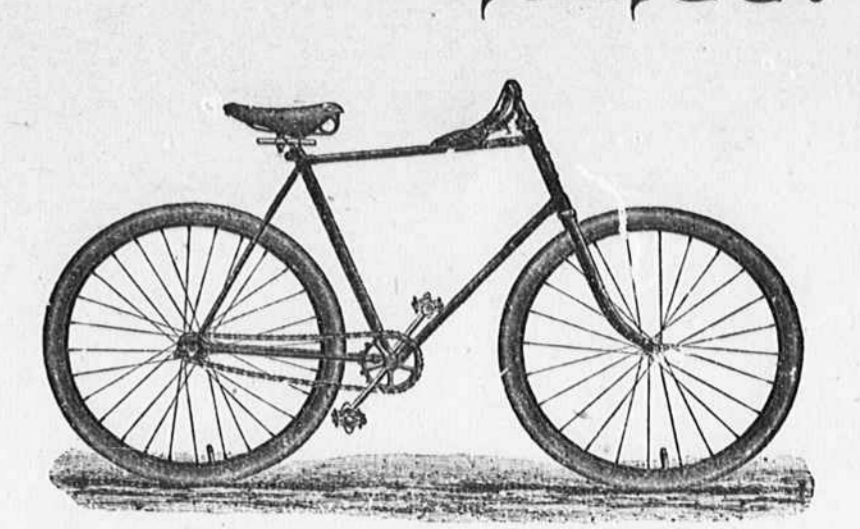
