ONE DOLLAR A YEAR.

Hereafter THE ADVERTISER will be sent one year for one dollar to persons who will pay in advance.

Numbers of persons complain that the price of THE ADVERTISER is too high. They say that one dollar a year is enough.

The price of the paper is placed at one dollar a year only because subscribers refuse to pay for it in advance.

When the proprietor has to take the risk of frequently getting nothing for the paper, and besides, has to pay for collecting, there is no profit at all in publishing the paper at one dollar.

Therefore, in order that there may be no reason for complaint, THE ADVERTISER will be sent one year to any person who pays the dollar in advance.

Subscribers in arrears who wish the paper at one dollar must of course settle their arrears and may then pay one dollar in advance for the twelve months ensuing.

This rule will be rigidly adhered to. The cash must be paid before the paper is sent, else the price will remain one dollar and a half.

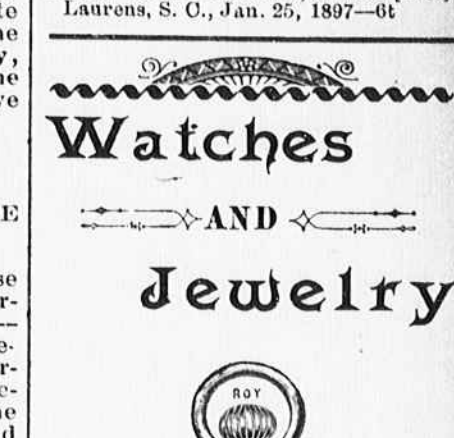
