The Laurens County Summer School will be held in the Graded School building at Laurens, beginning at 10 o'clock a. m., June 8th and continuing for four weeks, closing on July 4th.

The State Superintendent of Education has appointed B. L. Jones, Superintendent City Schools, as Principal, and Miss Josephine McSwain, of Cross Hill, Assistant.

Mr. Jones is regarded as one of the leading Graded School men of the State. He graduated at Newberry College in 1893, and has ceaselessly been doing school work ever since. His first work was in the Newberry Graded School under Supt. Evans. He taught two years in the public schools at Coleman, Texas. Three years he was Principal of one of the Public Schools of Columbia. Before coming to Laurens he was Superintendent of the schools in Yorkville. For two years he has been serving most efficiently the patrons of the Laurens City Schools

To this end discussions and questions on doubtful points will be given. Methods of teaching grammar and ideas for making the study more interesting will be suggested. 
