Committee on Cotton Ware Houses Make Report.

COLUMBIA, March 7th - The Warehouse Committee of the South Carolina Division of the Southern Cotton Association, consisting of the following gentlemen: E. W. Robertson, Columbia; W. E. Burnett, Spartanburg; T. B. Stackhouse, Dillon; Leroy Springs, Lancaster; B. H. Harris, Pendleton; L. W. Youmans, Fairfax, met in the office of the Association to-day, and adopted the following resolutions:

Resolved 1st: That this Committee recommend to every community in South Carolina, where the necessity for warehouses exists, to build these warehouses through their efforts, or by outside assistance if proffered or if possible to obtain, at a cost of from \$500 to \$1,200, with a storage capacity respectively of from 500 to 1,000 bales of cotton.

Resolved 2nd: That we urge upon the farmers the importance of storing their cotton promptly upon being ginned, in the standard warehouses, where they can get negotiable warehouse receipts, thus saving it from loss in weight and damage, and putting it in negotiable shape so that they will not be forced to market it except at their own pleasure; as has been demonstrated by the action of the New Orleans Convention that reasonable prices can be obtained, irrespective of the size of the crop, by judicious marketing; and this can only be accomplished by an effective warehouse system.

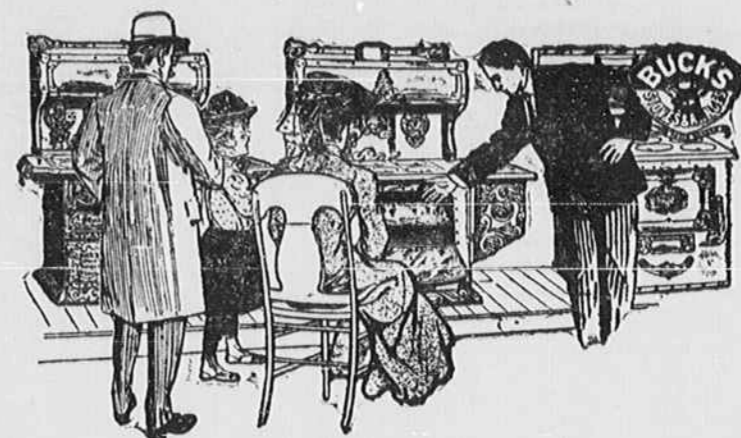

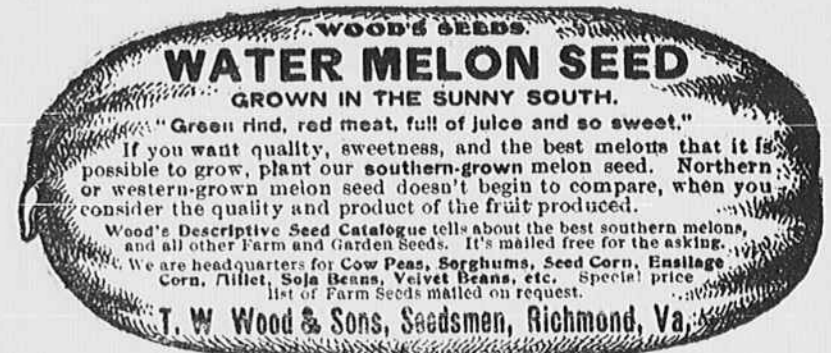
