A good part of Wednesday was consumed by the trial of John Henry Anderson charged with the murder of his father-in-law at Cedar Grove church on September 1st of last year. Josh Carter, an old negro, was shot to his death by the hand of Anderson at the grave of Anderson's child, who was on that day being buried. Anderson was not living with his wife of unplement relations with his fathershulaw. At the time, Amterson was in hidling for the showing of Air. died and was being buried, Anderson turned up at the courch and was seated inside when he saw through the door Josh Carter and wife drive up in the yard. When they had about thinhed unlitching their team, Anderson got up, went out into the yard, met Carter and without a word shot him, without a word or sign but the drawing of his pistol. After shooting Carter, Anderson turned and tried to shoot Carter's wife, but his piatol snapped.

Judge Prince appointed Afforneys Richey, Jr., and Blackwell to defend Anderson, which they did ably, but to no avail, the jury finding a ryedict of "guilty of murder". New trial was refused.
