INSURANCE MONEY IN LAURENS, \$52,500 Invested by Companies in Laurens County Bonds.

Columbia, May 28th.—Insurance Commissioner McMaster is receiving many letters from foreign insurance companies doing business in South Carolina telling of the investments made in this state by the different companies and also commending him for the position he has taken in the matter.

The following investments have been reported by the companies: \$50,000 in Charleston, \$20,000 in Laurens county bridge improvement bonds, \$7,000 in Columbia bonds, \$7,500 in Sullivan township bonds in Laurens county, \$11,000 in Columbia bonds, \$5,000 in Oconee county school bonds, \$7,500 in city of Abbeville electric bonds, \$25,000 in city of Clinton electric light and water works bonds, \$5,000 in Lee county bonds, \$15,000 in Spartanburg county bridge fund bonds, and \$10,000 in city of Abbeville bonds.
