

DR. GEO. L. MARTIN DIES AT GREENVILLE

Prominent Physician and Valuable Citizen Passes Away at Age of 55-

Was a Native of Laurens. Dr. Geo. L. Martin, a native and former citizen of Laurens county, died at his home in Greenville last Thursday. The Greenville News of Friday has the following account of his death:

Dr. George Lafayette Martin died vesterday morning at his home on the Buncombe road about ten o'clock. In the death of this man, the county and whole Piedmont section of the state loses one of its most influential and faithful servants. He was 55 years old at the time of his death, and leaves a family of four sons and a daughter. His wife, and a father 90 years old survive him also. Dr. Martin has been for the past eight years the special quarantine and vaccination agent of the state board of health, appointed for the counties of the Piedmont section of the state. The funeral will be held from the residence this morning. the services being at the First Baptist church at eleven o'clock. The masons will take a prominent part in the funeral, Dr. Martin having been one of the leading members of that fra-

Dr. Martin leaves four sons, Broadis, John, Henry and Lewis, and a daughter, Georgia. He is survived also by his wife and a father, Mr. Lewis leaves an aunt, Mrs. W. B. Madden, who during his early years gave him the care and kind treatment of a son, his mother having died when he was in infant.

The funeral services were held at morning and the interment made in the city cemetery.
