### "AM IN ATLANTA RUNNING AWAY"

So W. B. Avant Writes Back to His Kinsman, D. W. Avant at Georgetown.

Georgetown, May 19.—That W. B. Avant has left for parts unknown is now certain and Sheriff Scurry is offering a reward of \$100 for his apprehension.

As was published in yesterday's State, Avant left his home, Andrews, near here, Sunday morning last, saying he was going on to the penitentiary to serve his term of three and a half years for the killing of Ruth Crisp Bigham. The sheriff discovered today a letter which D. W. Avant, uncle of W. B. Avant, received in today's mail, the contents of which were, "I am running away," signed W. B. Avant. This letter was post-marked Atlanta, 1:20 p. m., May 17. Sheriff Scurry has wired the sheriff of Atlanta, also the chief of police and the detective authorities to be on the lookout for Avant.

Mrs. W. B. Avant also received a letter from him in today's mail, but what the contents of this letter are has not yet been learned.

**Bigham Out of Country.**  
 Sheriff Scurry also has a letter from the sheriff at Greenville, saying, in part, that he has recently had a talk with Dr. Bigham's brother at that place, who states that Dr. Bigham is not in the United States. Sheriff Scurry says that he intends to make every effort possible to apprehend Avant and Bigham, but the chances now seem doubtful.

D. W. Avant and George Parsons, close relatives of Avant, are on his bond for \$2,000, while Dr. Bigham's mother is on his for \$1,500.
