

RESULTS OF FIRST PRIMARY ELECTION

State Executive Committee Passes on the Returns.

HAMPTON AND CANSLER

Some Confusion Caused By An Error in Greenville Vote for Railroad Commissioner.

The State Democratic executive committee met Friday night in Columbia and declared the official result of the first primary election. The returns then at hand placed James Cansler and O. C. Scarborough in the second race for railroad commissioner, but on Saturday it developed that an error had been made in reporting the vote from Greenville county, this report giving Scarborough 3,386 instead of 386, the total number of votes received by him in Greenville. This correction, therefore, gives Hampton a lead of 640 votes and places him in the second contest with Cansler of Tirzah.

It is stated that this error cost the Democratic party over \$500 as the tickets with Mr. Scarborough's name thereon had been printed and sent to the express office when the mistake was discovered in Columbia. New tickets have been printed, however, and there will be no further hitch in the matter.

The following are declared to be in the second race, the executive committee having held an extra meeting Monday night when Mr. Hampton instead of Mr. Scarborough was given official place on the ticket with Cansler:

- For Governor, C. L. Blease.
- C. C. Featherstone, For Adjutant General.
- W. W. Moore, J. M. Richardson, For Railroad Commission.
- James Cansler, G. McDuffie Hampton, Those Elected.

The following were declared as having been elected on the first primary: Chas. A. Smith, lieutenant governor; J. Fraser Lyon, attorney general; R. M. McCown, secretary of State; A. W. Jones, comptroller general; J. E. Swearingen, state superintendent of education; R. H. Jennings, State treasurer. These are declared the nominees of the Democratic party.

The following were declared the nominees for congress from the various districts: George S. Legare, First district; A. F. Lever, Seventh district; Wyatt Aiken, Third district; Joseph T. Johnson, Fourth district; D. E. Finley, Fifth district.

A second primary is ordered from the following congressional districts: Second district, James F. Byrnes, Jas. O. Patterson; Sixth District, J. E. Elberbe, J. A. Hodges.

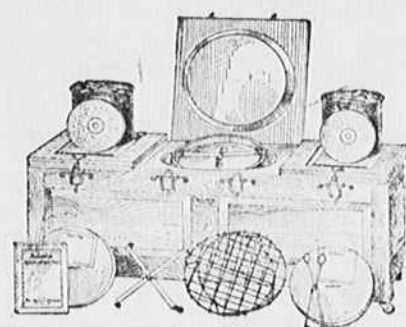
