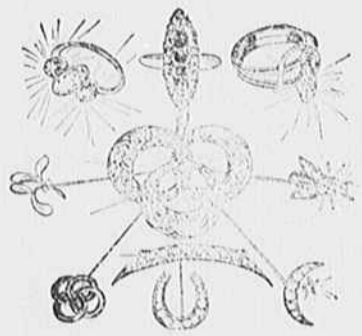

**CAPT. O. W. BABB TO SUCCEED BROCK**

Laurens Man Will be appointed Adjutant to General Boyd, Effective November 1.

Capt. Oscar W. Babb, whom Adjutant General Boyd will recommend for appointment as adjutant general with the rank of colonel, to succeed Col. William T. Brock, resigned, has tendered his resignation as captain of the Traynham Guards, the local military company. Capt. Babb's resignation is effective October 1. Meantime an election for officers of the local company, captain, first lieutenant second lieutenant, will be ordered. Col. Brock's resignation goes into effect November 1, at which time the new adjutant will assume the duties of the office.

Capt. Babb is regarded as thoroughly equipped for the new position, and his promotion is a matter of genuine gratification to his Laurens friends. He has been captain of the Traynham Guards since the organization of the company, four years ago, having been largely instrumental in effecting its formation. He also holds the position of deputy to the clerk of the court, having been appointed to this place about nine years ago. He is an expert penman and copyist, and withal a very efficient man in his several capacities of public service.

**WILL DETECT FUTURE ERRORS.**

**Chairman Jones Will Do Away With Probability of Counting In Wrong Man.**

Willie Jones, chairman of the State Democracy, has perfected a plan whereby mistakes in making up the final returns upon which to declare the nominee of the party will be eliminated in the future. This will prevent a repetition of the Greenville mistake which cost the State executive committee nearly \$500.

The plan of Gen. Jones is to add the total vote for all candidates for each office. Therefore should the candidates for railroad commissioner receive 4,000 votes and the candidate for railroad commissioner receive 7,000 votes, the mistake could be easily detected.
