

#### New England's Inconsistency,

Was it right to secede? In 1803 when the Louisiana purchase matter was pending and it seemed probable that the South would have additional representation in congress, New England said: "We will go out of the Union if you take in this new State." Josiah Quincy said: "It will be the right of all and the duty of some to prepare for separation amicably if possible, forcibly if necessary."


