## BRAVE AND GALLANT MEN OF CLINTON MARCHED TO FRONT AT COUNTRY'S CALL

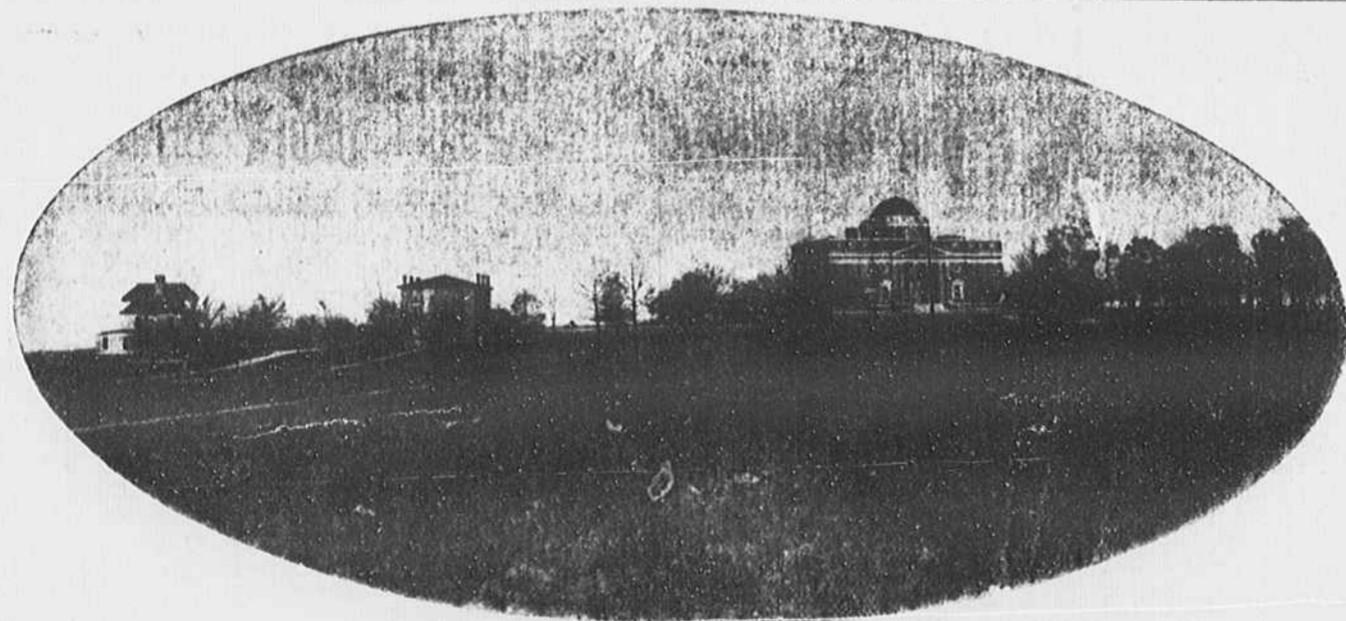
Any attempt to publish a list of all the men of Clinton and vicinity who fought under the Stars and Bars would be impracticable. In the words of a well-informed Clinton man, son of a distinguished veteran, "Clinton and this section of Laurens county enlisted about every man and boy able to carry arms; as brave and gallant an array of men as ever marched."  
Mr. R. Z. Wright, secretary of Camp R. S. Owens, kindly allowed this writer to make a copy of an "Honor Roll of Confederate Veterans Enlisting from Clinton and Vicinity," contained in the records of Camp R. S. Owens, No. 932, U. C. V. This roll contains the names of men now dead who enlisted at the beginning of the war and served until their deaths or the end of the war. It is not official but represents the voluntary labor of a few men, the late Mr. Jas. P. Dillard being a leader in collecting the data. It is hardly possible that the list is complete or entirely free from errors, and those who can supply omissions or remedy oversights will confer a favor on all students of local history
