All bids to be endorsed: "Proposals for Remodelling and Enlarging County Court House." Said proposals to be opened upon the above date and time in public by the Commissioners. All work and materials must conform to plans and specifications thereon on file at the office of the said Commissioners at Laurens, S. C., and of the Associate Architects A. Ten Eyck Brown and Proffitt & Hampton at their offices in Atlanta, Ga. and Spartanburg, S. C.

Copies of drawings and specifications may be obtained from the above architects at Atlanta upon making a deposit for each set of a certified

check for \$20.00, to be returned to the maker upon receipt of said drawings and specifications in good condition.

All bids shall be submitted on special proposal blanks furnished by said Architects, or they will not be considered, and each proposal must be accompanied by a certified check of two per cent of the amount of the bid as a guarantee that the successful bidder will enter into a contract according to said plans and specifications.
