## EARLY ADMITS RECEIVING GRAFT

Liquor Drummer Got Over Six Thousand Dollars out of One Deal and Doesn't Mind Saying So.

Columbia, Sept. 28.—John T. Early who was the only witness of the afternoon session of the label case in which J. B. Towill, L. W. Boykin and W. O. Tatum are charged with conspiracy to defraud the state, received according to his own testimony \$6,534 of the amount alleged to have been "grafted" by the defendants in the purchase of 21,000,000 labels for whiskey bottles at a price of \$35,000 when these labels were worth according to the prosecution only some \$9,000 or \$10,000.

The greater part of the session this afternoon was consumed in arguments as to the admission of evidence but the testimony obtained from Early, although small in bulk, was among the most important so far brought out. Early is now a salesman for a liquor house in Cincinnati, but appears at that time to have been connected with the Nivison-Weiskopf Company from whom the labels in question were purchased.

According to his testimony Early had had a conversation with the defendants in Columbia during early 1905 with reference to the label deal and had urged them to buy the labels saying that there was something in it for him. Later he was with Boykin and Tatum during a visit to Cincinnati when the Weiskopf firm was visited with the purpose of buying labels, bottles and supplies. The witness was interrupted at nearly every question with objections. "What part of the profit on this deal were you to receive?" was asked by Mr. Lyon. Answer: "One third." "Did you get it?" "Yes sir." "State whether or not this is the check you received in payment for this third." The witness identified a check which was then placed in evidence. It was dated October 20, 1905, was payable to John T. Early and the amount was \$6,534.

It was signed by the Nivison-Weiskopf Company. Dennis Weiskopf president. After an hour's discussion, by the attorneys, the witness was allowed to repeat portions of a conversation with M. A. Goodman, one of the defendants in the indictment, though not now on trial. The effect was that Goodman had told the witness that he had paid Boykin \$3,000, Tatum \$3,000 and some amount, not exactly remembered, to Towill, also some money was paid according to the statement to another employee of the dispensary, named McCarthy. In answer to questions the witness stated that Goodman had said the money of which he received one third was part of the expense of securing the business. Early will probably be on the stand tomorrow morning as he has not yet been cross examined.—Greenville News.

## GOLD MINING IN SOUTH CAROLINA

Figures of United States Geological Survey for 1910 Show Larger Output

The mine production of gold in South Carolina in 1910 was 1,853.92 fine ounces, valued at \$38,324, according to H. D. McCaskey, of the United States Geological Survey, an increase in value over the output of 1909 of \$27,271. The silver production was 46 fine ounces, valued at \$25, in 1910; as against 182 ounces, valued at \$97, in 1909. There was a small output of copper reported from South Carolina in 1909, but not in 1910. The value of the total production of precious metals in South Carolina was \$38,349 in 1910 as against \$11,075 in 1909.

The yield of gold and silver reported from South Carolina in 1910 was from 10 placers and 2 deep mines. The total quantity of ore reported from the deep mines in 1910 was 24,153 short tons, all of siliceous gold ore, with an average recoverable value of \$1.50 per ton. The placers yielded 100.42 fine ounces of gold in South Carolina, and the remainder of the production—1,753.50 fine ounces—was from deep mines.

## COTTON FARMERS WANT BETTER PRICES FOR PRODUCT

called to the fact that published quotations on train load lots of timothy hay is \$30 a ton, with a certainty of advance to \$40 a ton before the season is over, and a corresponding advance in wheat, corn and oats, we do especially advise the sowing of rye, or rye and vetch, or rye and wheat and barley on one or more acres—according to size of farm—of the richest lands for a hay crop to be cut about April 1, each year, to meet the need for hay before the mature oat crop is ready to harvest.

"Second, That it is urged that all farmers gather and care for all hay possible in and around their places, even to the extent of cutting grass off the smaller patches that have heretofore gone to waste, and all cotton lands as soon as the cotton is picked where the hay is worth cutting, some of which is good for a ton per acre; and we suggest these grassy fields and bottom places be picked as soon as possible; that this hay, the finest the land has ever produced, may be saved before it is too old, sacrificing if need be some cotton for the hay, which in many fields is worth more than the entire cotton crop, at present prices.

"Third, That in view of these conditions it appears almost certain that the value of cotton seed is far above the present price, and the shortage of other food crops will force the price of this wood product very much higher than prevails at this time.

"Fourth, And it is recommended that the sale of cotton seed be withheld at present, and until such a time as the trade is willing to pay a price in keeping with its importance as one of the great food products of the world.

"There would be no danger in feeding hay that might contain more or less second growth of cotton."

This was the report by the feed stuff chemist and was added to the resolution.—The State.
