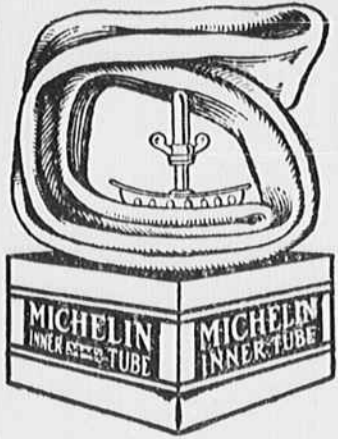

A CLINCHFIELD BRANCH.

Gaffney Citizens to Organize to Build Branch Road to Chesnee to Tap Clinchfield.

Gaffney, Oct. 20.—A movement has been launched by Gaffney men, backed by the board of trade, to secure a branch railroad from this city to Chesnee to tap the Clinchfield, Carolina & Ohio at that point. It is not definitely known as yet just what progress has been made by those who are working on the matter, but it is said that considerable headway has been made. It is the plan to raise \$25,000 at the start in order that the preliminary work may be done as rapidly and quickly as possible, and then later, if possible, the line will be leased to some railroad company to operate. It is not the intention, however, of the promoters of the scheme to relinquish entire control of the road. It is thought that the money will be raised without any great difficulty. The business men of the town seem to want some such connection, and if they are willing to back the scheme with their capital the road will be a reality. This is the first time that any positive action has been attempted in the matter.

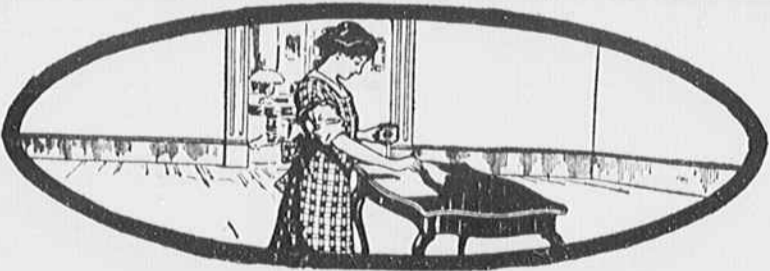
