Part of this amount will be used to pay up the notes of which the loan of \$500,000 is made up, and a large amount will be needed for the interest on the State debt. The county treasurers are sending in the State tax money very slowly, and all rire urged to pay up as soon as possible. The collection of taxes was begun on October 15, and only about \$75,000 has been received so far. R. H. Jennings, the State treasurer, will soon prepare his annual report to the general assembly. 
