So Says Col. Thompson Concerning His Cotton Plan.

Washington, Dec. 27.-Col. Robert M. Thompson, of New York, head of the syndicate which proposed to advance \$50,000,000 for the purpose of handling the Southern cotton crop blames the Southern planter for the delay in putting the scheme into effect. He declared here today that the syndicate still was ready to proceed with the plan, which he said meant everything to the Southern farmer.

"We did not reject the plan," he declared. "It was the South which rejected it; and the Southern farmers are opposed to it only because they do not understand it. They will have to be educated into the knowledge that our scheme is not a speculative one, as they have been led South to believe.

"As it is, a number of individual farmers of the South have expressed their desire to have us handle their crop for them on the plan which we proposed for the entire south. "The Southern cotton farmers this year will lose \$300,000,000; and the trouble is that at least \$200,000,000 of this will go abroad. The whole country, not only the South, will be the loser by the South's refusal to accept the economic proposition we submit-
