# **BLEASE IMPEACHED**

Stirring Times in the Legislature During the Last Session-Senator Waller, of Greenwood Goes on Warpath.

Columbia, Feb. 29.-The 1912 session of the general assembly was brought to a close at 3:45 o'clock this afternoon after one of the stormiest days of the session.

The house refused to concur with the senate to take a recess until March 17. The lower branch, adjourned at 3:30 o'clock and the senate was forced to concur.

The members left for their homes this afternoon and tonight.

The senate, after the stormiest session of the year, in which the governor was warmly denounced by Senator Waller, of Greenwood, who called upon the house to vote to impeach him if he further ignored recommendations of the general assembly, and in which denunciations Sen-Guaranteed to keep your other senators, sent to the governor ator Waller was little opposed by Stock in a healthier and a list of appointments recommended by it, some of which the governor had formerly refused to consider, and all of which he ignored when he sent his final message to the senate, telling the body that he had no further communications for it and stating that he would leave in the afternoon for the upper part of the state, where he had an engagement.

Senator Clifton said that if the senate, being in session, submits for appointment, the governor is bound by law to make the appointments or allow the offices to hold open.

Senator Waller was the orator of the day and his words were those of war. He held the floor for a long time and urged the senate to uphold the prerogatives of the state. He said that a crisis had been reached and called upon the senators to "do your duty." He urged them to remain in session until the crisis had passed. He characterized the senate as "the power behind the governor" He said he was sorry the governor
