With a tremble in his eye, he placed his hand on my curly head and said to the mother "Let the child alone, Liza, it's bred in the love!" I didn't know what he meant by that, but I did know by the tremble, I could sing the song all I pleased and now today they are gone, all

gone—the dear, precious mother—the gentle lovable father and the old time dinky that we knew and felt was a friend.
Wiser heads and stouter hearts than mine look ahead with something of fear—they know not what—when the time shall come when all these negroes that were once slaves are gone. They had and will have as long as they live, an abiding faith and love for the white man. What shall happen "when another generation comes that knew not Joseph?"
