8,849,898 BALES GINNED TO NOV. 1ST.

Million Under the Record for Corresponding Period of sast Year.

Washington, Nov. 8 .- The fourth cot-

tou ginning report of the season, compiled from reports of census bureau prespondents and agents throughout the cotton belt and issued at 10 a. m. today by Director E. Dana Durand, announced that 8,848,898 bales of cotton, counting round as half bales, of the growth of 1912 had been ginned prior to November 1. To that date last year 9,970,905 bales, or 64.1 per cent of the entire crop, had been ginned; in 1908 to that date 8,191,557 bales, or 62..6 per cent of the crop had been ginned, and in 1906 to that date 6,906,395 bales, or 53.2 per cent of the crop had been ginned.

Included in the total ginnings were 55,811 round bales, compared with 68,-313 bales last year, 81,183 bales in 1910, 109,621 bales in 1909 and 149,866 bales in 1908.

The number of sea island cotton bales included was 28,655 compared with 56,563 bales last year, 55,237 bales in 1909 and 45,276 bales in 1908.


