ROUND UP OF COCAINE VENDERS. President

Sheriff Owings and Other Officers Arrested Three Negroes in Clinton for Transporting Cocaine.

Three negroes have been lodged in the county jail by Sheriff Owings on the charge of transporting cocaine, they having been arrested in Clinton after a systematic plan had been carried out by the sheriff, Deputy Reid and Chief Mason of Clinton, to entrap them in the nefarious traffic. The negroes arrested were Arthur Gary, Robert Hill and Nathan Williams.

The arrests were made after the negroes had taken several shipments of cocaine from the post office. The sheriff's office got wind of the expected shipment and laid nets to catch the consignees. Plans worked out as expected and the negroes were caught with the goods on them. They had in their possession enough of the dope to kill quite a number of people.

The shipment of cocaine through the mails for illegal use is prohibited by federal laws and this violation has been reported to the postal authorities and it is probable that the shippers will be caught in the net spread for the consignees. No warrant has as yet been issued for them, but the post office department is expected to take some action in the matter.
